The daily schedule may subject to change. Any changes to the schedule will be announced by the Meet Director at the Daily Team Leader Briefing or Pilot Briefing and posted on the notice board.

4. Competitors

Numbers of competitors :

- The maximum number of pilots in the championship is 100.
- Junior U26 Pilot is Male and Female pilot who compete with limitation by the Age 26 yo and below, they can also compete in overall and teams. The age determine by the calender year in which the pilot has his birthday.
- The maximum number of pilots constituting a team is 4 total, will be count 3 best per round.

Selection Procedures :

1. Pilot qualification criteria as per Section 7C 2.2.1.
2. An International Pilot Proficiency Identification (IPPI) card to stage 4 standard or,
3. If the competitors country issues paragliding license, this should be equivalent to IPPI 4.

5. Entry Fee

Entry Application Deadline and Allocation

The Entry Fee will be:

- \$ 36,00/IDR 600.000

The entry fee includes :

- Transportation subsidies of IDR 1.200.000 for the first 40 participants who paid the entry fee (Indonesian Only - from outside of East Borneo). Subsidy will be delivered on Re-registration day.
- Accomodation
- Transport to the take-off
- Pilot Competition's Kit
- ID card & safety / contact information,
- Lunch & dinner during competition day
- Land transportation from Balikpapan to Paser
- First aid medical service

7. Registration

Pre-registration of the pilots must be done at the official web site :

1. Paragliding.web.id
2. civlcomps.org

The official registration will be on: 09am – 1pm at Sekretariat.

Each competitor will be required to present :

- Personal Identity
- A valid pilot's license.
- Glider and equipment that meets the requirements and airworthiness
- Proof of valid insurance as detailed.
- Each competitor must have a valid FAI Sporting License, which will be checked before the start of the competition using the FAI's Sporting License database.

Each competitor will be required to sign:

- The Waiver Declaration (Agreement on release of liability).
- The Certified Glider / Equipment Statement.
- The Entry Form.

Attention!

The Safety briefing will be held in the Competition headquarters and attendance is mandatory for all competitors. **Pilots who do not attend this meeting will not have rights to complain and protest.**

8. Insurance

The organizers require that documentary proof in English must be presented to the registration before the start of the championship of :

- Valid paragliding competitions personal health and accident insurance. This must include all medical treatment if required.

9. Equipment

General :

All equipment must comply with S7C part 8.

Contest numbers :

The pilot ID numbers supplied by the organizers must be visible and placed on leg of pilot specified at registration.

Radio : Pilots are to carry a radio able to receive and transmit on the safety Frequency.

Pilot Frequency : 149-290

Reserve Frequency: 149-390

10. Safety Committee

The Safety Committee will include:

- Meet Director,
- Launch Marshal (or Deputy),
- Senior member of Judging Team,
- A minimum of two experienced pilots (one local, one visitor) who must be competitors.

They will be elected by the team leaders.

11. Competition site

Take Off Site : Sultan Hills

Altitude: 200 m ASL

Wind direction: S, SE, E

Grass Field

Landing Area: Seaside Land

Altitude: 20 m ASL.

Landing area is a field land

12. Launch

Method:

Competition will be hill launch take off. Competitors must have good wind as well as strong wind takeoff skills. At the Launch Marshal discretion, a pilot may be temporarily stood down or permanently withdrawn from the competition if he/she appears unable to launch safely in wind and weather conditions that fall within operating limits. Competitors not ready to fly in the established flying order when called forward to launch by the Launch Marshall, or who take off without the Launch Marshall's permission, will be liable to a maximum score.

Other:

According to Section 7C

13. Number of Rounds

Twelve (12) maximum, in accordance with Section 7C

This will be a 'Knock out' event, in accordance with Section 7C 5.4.4.3

- All pilots will fly in the first 6 rounds of the competition.
- The best 60 pilots will then continue to fly in 7th and 8th rounds
- The best 40 pilots will then continue to fly in 9th and 10th rounds,
- The best 20 pilots will fly 11th and 12th rounds
- The 11th and 12th rounds will be flown in reverse order

According to section 7C:

- Pilot who do not continue in the competition after applying the KO rule, will be marked DNQ (did not qualify) in these round

14. Prize and Award

Detail:

OVERALL

WOMEN

1st Place: IDR 20.000.000 2nd Place: IDR 12.000.000 3rd Place: IDR 8.000.000

JUNIOR OVERALL (Under 26 years old)

1st Place: IDR 18.000.000 2nd Place: IDR 12.000.000 3rd Place: IDR 8.000.000

Note :

- 1. All in rupiah currency and Indonesia subject to 5 % tax (with NPWP) and Foreigner subject to 20 % tax*
- 2. All taxes based on Indonesia tax law.*

15. Wind Speed and Limitation

The maximum permitted wind speed at each target area, for the purposes of competition is 6 m/s. The Competition will use a wind recording and scoring system at the target, with visual and acoustic warnings of exceeding limits.

16. Scoring

According to Section 7C

The score of an individual shall be the aggregate of all the scores achieved by that competitor. When five or more valid rounds are completed, the worst one individual score is dropped. Every officially registered competitor should fly at least once during the competition to remain a valid, scoring competitor.

1. Individual score

According to Section 7C. 5.4.4.3 Knock out (KO)

In the first 6 round all the pilots fly the competition.

Thereafter:

- The top 60 ranked pilots will continue to fly in the 7 th and 8th rounds.
- The top 40 ranked pilots will fly in the 9th and 10th rounds, and
- The best 20 ranked pilots will fly 11 th and 12th round in reverse order.

Pilots who do not qualify in the rankings as listed above, will not continue the competition, will be marked as DNQ (did not qualify) in the scoring.

2. Women, Junior Score

According to Section 7C. Para 5.4.4.4

After the KO in round 6 at least top 6 ranked women, juniors and masters will continue until the end of the competition, regardless of whether they qualify or not.

Women, juniors and masters who did not qualify, compete only in their specific category ranking to fight for specific category medal.

For women, juniors and masters who achieved the right to compete in their specific categories, but did not qualify in the overall category, their position in the overall ranking is frozen.

Only the overall ranking is eligible for WPRS ranking

3. Team score

The team is four competitor and score for each round will be calculated as the aggregate score of the best three pilots in the team. If any team has fewer than three competitor, then for each round a maximum score will be awarded to the team for each of the scores for which there is no competitor.

According to Section 7C. Para 5.4.5.1

After KO in round 6, only the top 6 ranked teams continue until the end of the competition.

The results of those pilots who are team members in the 6 top ranked teams, but who did not individually qualify for the next round of competition in the overall ranking, will only count towards the team competition. The ranking of the teams who did not qualify is frozen.

4. Result publishing

As soon as it is practical at the end of the round, the recorder will post the scores on the main notice board. These will be marked Provisional, with the posting time and date clearly visible. Any complaint against the Provisional scores must be lodged within 2 hours of the scores being posted.

If provisional scores were posted more than 2 hours after sunset and before 6.00 am next day, then the deadline for a complaint is 8.30 am the next day.

17. Landing

Competitors will be scored according to the distance in centimeters between their first point of ground contact and the edge of the dead center (2 cm) disc to a maximum score of 200 cm.

The measuring field will have clearly marked circles set at 1 m and 2 m. Otherwise according to Section S7C.

18. Video Evidence

Organizer will provide video recording on the landing. In the case where amateur video evidence is available when an official complaint is made, the Chief Judge reserves the right to choose whether and when to view that video evidence. The decision will be made on a case-by-case basis. Further information on the policy on video evidence will be provided at the first pilot briefing.

A lack of video evidence is not a valid reason to award a re-launch.

19. Training , Practice and free flight

After the official start of Championships, competitors are prohibited from conducting training, practice, test and free flights using the landing site, except with the express permission from the Meet Director.

Flying from other local sites is allowed, however, these activities must not be associated with the Championship or the Organization in any way.

Official pre fliers will take-off as directed by the Meet Director or Safety Director.

20. Penalties

In accordance with Section 7C

21. Task Information

Information board at the landing field will show:

- the results,
- information related to competition and/or social events.

22. Complaints and Protests

Objections, complaints and protests will be deal with according to the procedures in Section 7C and the Sporting Code General Section.

Complaints should be made with the minimum delay and will be deal with expeditiously.

Complain decisions should do by the pilot it self and the pilot does not communicate with the team leader and other.

If the complainant is not satisfied with the outcome, the team leader/pilot can make a written protest to the Meet Director or his deputy. The protest fee is USD 30 it will be returned if the protest is upheld.

The Official Protest forms and printed copies of S7C will be available at the Recorder table, with the Launch Marshal and Chief Judge.

23. Emergency Procedures

A first aid team will be present at the landing during competition days. The closest hospital is located in Paser. The hospital can handle serious injuries. An ambulance to Paser, in case of very complicated injuries, it takes about 30 minutes. There is no helicopter on standby for this event.
